How to disclose your invention to OTL

To properly protect your discoveries, submit an invention disclosure to OTL as soon as possible. Timeliness of disclosure is especially important for inventions conceived

and/or made with federal or state agency funding. Under the requirements of the federal Bayh-Dole Act of 1980 and University of Florida policy, university employees are required to disclose to OTL all new discoveries that are potentially patentable.
